Manuscript Submission Guidelines (Style Sheet)

1. All submissions should be in MS-Word, 1.5 spaced throughout (not only the text but also displayed quotations, notes, references, and any other matter) on single-sided numbered page.
2. A cover page must be provided mentioning the title of the article and the author's name, professional affiliation, addresses (both postal and e-mail) and phone numbers.
3. All submissions must include an **Abstract** (between 150-200 words) and five (05) **keywords** at the beginning of the essay.
4. The word limit of the manuscript must not exceed **6000 words** including references / bibliography.
5. Figures / Illustrations / Maps (as applicable) must be in 600dpi not exceeding eight (8) in a single paper and the same must be attached separately as a jpeg file with email.
6. **In-text citations:** Citations placed within the text of your paper to direct readers to the full reference entry, using either parenthetical (e.g., (Author, Year)) or narrative (e.g., Author (Year)) formats.
7. Research articles should adhere to the specified structure, encompassing the following elements in the outlined order:
 1. Title Page
 2. Abstract
 3. Keywords
 4. Main Text
 5. Acknowledgements
 6. Declaration of Interest Statement
 7. References / Bibliography
 8. Appendices (as applicable)
8. Referencing Style: References should be provided as endnotes. A **Reference List** (Bibliography) should provide a complete list of all references cited in the article. Do not distinguish between primary and secondary references; they must all be included in one alphabetized list.
