### Introduction








### **Central Asian Museum**

After the establishment of the Centre of Central Asian Studies (CCAS) in 1978-79, it was on the advice of the then Chief Minister of J & K State, Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah, that the Founder-Director of CCAS, Prof. S. Magbool Ahmed (1978-83) moved a proposal with regard to the establishment of a Central Asian Museum (CAM) which in future was to be an important component of the CCAS with the aim to strengthen it by showcasing archaeological material depicting history, culture and heritage of Kashmir and Central Asia. Housed temporarily in the first floor of Allama Igbal Library, the Central Asian Museum (CAM) was formally inaugurated by Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah on 24th of October, 1981 and preserves and showcases the rich cultural and historical connections between Kashmir and Central Asia. It began with 254 artefacts, later expanding to 1,170 items, including ancient coins, manuscripts, sculptures, textiles, and fossils from regions like Tibet, China, Uzbekistan, and Ladakh. CAM has participated in major exhibitions, such as the Art of Kashmir in New York (2007-08) and the Iran-Kashmir Cultural Heritage Exhibition (2016). Over the years, CAM has attracted scholars and dignitaries from 39 countries, solidifying its role in promoting Kashmir's historical and artistic heritage.

Modern technologies such as GIS mapping, drone surveys, 3D reconstruction, LiDAR, and photogrammetry enhance archaeological accuracy, site documentation, and artifact analysis.

#### 4. Training & Public Engagement

CCAS organizes workshops, conferences, and training programs to develop research skills. It promotes preservation efforts through conservation strategies, exhibitions, and public awareness campaigns.





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
